ATTENDANCE LETTERS

Once again the Board has begun to send letters to members that have crossed the threshold of nine incidents. Note it is incidents and not days so 9 half days could get you the letter. We have been told that the specialized appointment days don't count but we do know members had these dates counted as well.

If you receive a letter there are certain steps that OECTA advised you to follow:

- I. Immediately call or email the office and let us know.
- 2. Inform your administrator that you will have a member of the Exec or your Rep attend.
- 3. Do not answer the 'goal setting questions' unless you are psychic and are able to predict the future. Your Rep or better

yet an Executive member will answer that question for you by asking 'are we going to play the horses or pick winning lottery numbers'.

4. Goal setting is an attempt to get you to commit to a certain number of days used AND if you fail that quota you are automatically considered for the next round of discipline. (oh I meant support)

OECTA Provincial objects to any data driven mechanical absent management program that does not look at every individual's circumstances before sending out these letters.

Members stoically go to work with a variety of medical and health concerns everyday.

OECTA rejects that belief that our teachers use their sick days frivolously or without just cause.

SHOULD YOU TAKE A FULL DAY OFF IF A HALF DAY COUNTS AS AN IN-CIDENT?

I have heard some employees say they will book the whole day if they are charged for a whole day even if they use a half day. Though this may make sense it uses up your paid days and specialized days quicker. We suggest if you can have an appointment in half a day then save the other half for another use later. We also say the same if you need a sick day because you are ill in the morning but know you will improve in the afternoon and will be able to work.

Again you know your health better than anyone. If you need a full day take a full day. If you think a half day (ie. morning sickness only) then take a half day.



Health and Safety Reporting Safe Schools Act and Incidents

Student Behaviour Concerns? Getting Kicked, Slapped, Spit On, Bit, Ducking Thrown Objects, Sworn At?

Then there are reports YOU MUST file!

The Safe Schools Act requires you to fill out a report for **EVERY** incident that happens that **could lead** to a suspension or more. Some of these include:

- *Threats to inflict serious bodily harm on another person
- *Possessing alcohol or illegal drugs
- *Being under the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs
- *Swearing at a teacher or person in a position of authority
- *Vandalism *Bullying
- *Any conduct injurious to the moral tone of the school or to the physical or mental well being of others.
- *Persistent Truancy *Persistent Opposition to Authority
- *Willful Destruction of School Property *Theft
- *Use of Profane/Improper Language *Use of Tobacco
- *Aid/Incite Harmful Behaviour
- *Fighting
- *Physical Assault/Sexual or Racial Harassment
- *Distribution of Hate Material or Hate Motivated Violence
- *Inappropriate Use of Electronic Media/Communication

There is **NO GREY** area.

Teachers are legally required to fill out the forms. Please ask your OECTA Reps for advice.

In addition most times an Incident Report will also need to be filled out to report injury and incidents to H and S

OTIP ADVICE: Fight the flood: Keep your property afloat

Springtime is almost here, and with it comes blooming flowers and crisp, fresh air. But as spring showers pour, Canadians are at risk for more damage than rained-out picnics – we're also at risk for property flooding.

Water damage to property can be expensive and frustrating, harming not only the home, but also possessions and the wellbeing of the people inside. Each year, springtime results in an increased number of water-related claims and, as homeowners are investing much more in their basements these days, it is important to take proactive steps to minimize the risk.

OTIP offers these tips for homeowners to keep their properties above water:

- **Inspect your roof:** To prevent leaks, get the roof inspected every few years to check the condition of the shingles. Clear out gutters to prevent blockages.
- Install a backwater valve: These valves close automatically if the sewer backs up and can prevent thousands of dollars in damage.
- Scope out your sump pump: If your basement
 has one, examine it and do a test run if it doesn't
 get used frequently.
- Check your foundation: This is especially important as the ice melts. If you notice water pooling, find a way to lead the liquid away from your home.
- **Start right:** If you are finishing your basement, make sure to seal your exterior walls.
- Examine your insurance: While overland flooding is generally not covered by insurance, you can add additional coverage, including protection from sewage backup.
