Provincial OECTA's Annual General Meeting was held last weekend, from Friday March 7th to Monday March 10th. Wellington was represented by our two members of Council of President's Mark Berardine and David Derewianko, our VP Elementary Heather Frimeth, our OTBU President Tim O'Brien, our VP OT Nancy Baker, our Secretary Sheila Hynes, Councilor Peter Stoop, Joint Health and Safety co-chair Laurence Vignola, Wellington's new Religion AQ Course Director Yvonne Runstedler, and Leadership member Dave Del Duca as well as two alternate delegates, Roy Coughlin and Becka Dupuis both members of the OTBU. Yes a lively group!

The AGM debated many issues and resolutions, elected next year's Provincial Executive, listened to many guest speakers and discussed the fees. This year's election was vocal as many candidates either phoned the office or requested a visit to meet our delegation. All candidates actively campaigned and sent letters to our Unit for support. The OTF Govenors, Table Officer and President were the only positions not up for election.

The AGM saw the first implementation of automated voting by using electronic 'clickers'. This 'evoting' had a few bumps to start but it certainly will change some of the lengthy time to collect ballots or count the close votes. The main reason it was brought forward was to accommodate those members who had trouble either holding up their voting cards for a long time or for those not able to stand during hotly debated votes where the members have to stand to show their support since the vote was so close.

The Fee debate is always behind almost every motion that contains financial implications. The House voted 30 to 70 % against a fee increase this year but most of the Provincial Executive agrees we need to have one by next year's AGM. Many were against a fee increase because of our roll back and wage freezes. We did find funding to fight against the upcoming Right To Work and anti-Union political parties. A Task Force was passed to look into the Handbooks rules on how the Disciplinary Committee, Provincial Executive and General Secretary function. In particular, the 15 year debate on full recognition of Joint Units for having two President's at Council of Presidents but only having one President's Allowance was finally passed. This means that next year our Unit will receive two allowances for both our members who sit on Council of Presidents.

This battle has been waged for a very long time. It is no doubt directly

related to our Unit's participation in the GTA President's Meetings where lobbying successfully convinced many Presidents of the need to correct this inequity. During the debate we used the mics to block opponents from speaking by asking a question thus by-passing the order of the Con mics. Many of our members also stood in line to get a chance to speak on issues, held the mic for others or asked questions during our break out sessions. Several other Unit Presidents as well as members of the Provincial Executive complemented our delegation for their active participation and conduct.

We also were visible at a variety of less business like events. We had a 'selfie' with the Minister of Education, a couple took over the line dancing and we found out elevators at the Harbour Castle were more like an amusement ride at times! Thanks to everyone who came.
