## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

January came in with a blast but our White Christmas was quickly lost in the review mirror as it flew by and we are starting February. We are quickly approaching the half way mark of the school year. January did give us a few issues that we need to remember and discuss both in teaching and in our families and communities.

First, Public Education remains the most important means to ensure our country strives to make the world a better place. As we are confronted with a new reality under the Trump era where the White House can propose 'Alternative Facts' as Facts we need to continue to educate students to discern, critically think and believe they are global citizens. As Catholic Teachers able to espouse our Catholic values we are better equipped to promote fairness, justice, respect and love thy neighbor.

With a right wing wave starting in Canada, with the likes of Lieth and O'Leary, expect more attacks on Government sector workers, Education and Health Care. Locally we will continue to strive to build alliances with our Labour Affiliates and Social Justice Groups to protect not only our rights but everyone's rights.

#### **Contract Tentative Agreement**

The last two weeks have been busy on the Provincial Bargaining Front. We already saw AEFO and CUPE reach tentative Extension agreements with the Government. Then OECTA reached a tentative agreement on Extension and ETFO followed suit as well.

Many, myself included, questioned the wisdom of signing an Extension while Thunder Bay Elem and Niagara Elem still do not have local agreements. A few arguments can be examined: 1. Can two rogue School Boards hold the entire OECTA Provincial Agreement on hold? 2. For OECTA to pass on a Provincial Agreement due to a local Collective Agreement is a break of Ministry of Labour rules the same as it would be for any of the five major unions to hold out for another union's deal and use that as a reason not to sign their own deal.

Monday everyone will see the contract extension proposal and we can weigh the pros and cons. Remember Confidential!

## **Contract 101 : Bereavement Reminders**

## Every few weeks we receive calls from Reps and Members regarding Bereavement. Here are the various leaves:

Leave of absence without loss of pay or reduction of sick leave shall be granted to a maximum of five (5) working days at time of death in the case of the death of an immediate member of his/her family for the purpose of arranging for and attending at the funeral. Immediate member of the family shall mean: spouse, parent, parent-in-law, brother, sister, or child.

With the prior approval of the Director of Education or designate a teacher may be allowed the use of up to two (2) of these days to be taken after the time of death to deal with estate administration issues.

Leave of absence without loss of pay or deduction of sick leave shall be granted to a teacher to a maximum of two (2) working days, to attend the funeral of a son-in-law, daughter-in-law, brother-in-law, or sister-in-law, grandparent or grandchild.

Leave of absence, without loss of pay or deduction of sick leave, shall be granted to a teacher to a maximum of one day to attend the funeral of a relative not specified in Article 7.03 (i) and (ii).

At the discretion of the Director or designate, a teacher may be granted up to two (2) additional days without pay, to meet the exigencies of distance, special circumstance or for persons not listed above.


