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REMEMBRANCE DAY 100

HEALTH AND SAFETY

WINTER IS COMING!

Watch out and report wet floors at entrances, mats where needed, signs posted saying slippery when wet, salt applied to ice and sidewalks cleared of snow. Make sure your foot wear is appropriate and remember to be work safe!

More and more of our school playgrounds are not plowed. If there are icy patches or rough surfaces these can be reported to the office as a safety hazard. Teachers must use their discretion if they have a field duty and they determine it is not safe to walk on. Report it and be Safe!

H and S is everyone's business and responsibility.

ONLINE REPORTING FORMS

We experienced a bumpy start to the year for this new process. The Incident/Accident Reports DID NOT have the give my union button on it and then it had it but it did not get to the office. When we discovered this we immediately informed the Board and it took almost a month for this to be addressed and then it took a few more weeks for the corrections. In September we only received 3 reports and were informed the others did not want their union to know.

That is problematic. If OECTA does not know we can't help protect anyone at all. Everyone is strongly encouraged to ensure that the OECTA Office receives a copy. Your accident may be the first instance of a health problem that could lead to sick time or even WSIB time. Your incident may be the first step to protecting yourself and your fellow staff members from repeated injury or risk of injury.

If you are threatened verbally, physically, or with attempted thrown objects you need to fill out these forms. In addition, you need to also fill out the Safe School Forms as behaviour seen could be an event that any student could get suspended from. IEP and Behaviour Plans DO NOT exempt students from having these forms filled out!

OECTA advises that you keep a printed copy of all reports.

Implications for BMS and Transport. If the BMS team is called to intervene or worse actually has to transport a student a Safe School Form should (must) be filled out. If any physical incidents take place then an incident form too.

CONTRACT 101

BENEFITS

If your contract changed from part time to full time, LTO to Permanent then the Board reports that to OTIP. Once received they start to process and send out new enrolment emails to everyone's Board email. If you already had an OTIP number it should not change whether from this Board or another. You should not wait longer than 5 weeks to see this email.

All OTs should have rec'd a daily OT enrolment email as well. Most of you we believe have rec'd this already but some of you were waiting for LTO or change in Permanent or Percentage of contract. These should be up to date as of Oct 1st status.

STAFF MEETINGS

One monthly staff meeting, after school, per working day of the 194 is mandatory. These staff meetings should all be posted at the start of the year though we realize sometimes there are changes. They are capped at 75 minutes.

OTIP ADVICE: PROTECTING YOUR HOUSE



- 1. **Keep doors and windows locked.** Ensure that all windows and doors are kept locked at all times even if you are inside your home or are only leaving briefly. It is also advised that when leaving your home for extended periods of time you keep valuables in a safe or lockbox that is stored out of sight. If you have electronic locks or passcodes to your garage or other points of entry be sure to change them periodically.
- 2. **Upgrade your locks.** You should consider adding a deadbolt lock to your home's entry doors, as well as upgrading your home's patio/sliding glass door lock if you have one. If you have recently moved into a new home, or have had your keys lost or stolen, ensure that you have changed all of the locks.
- 3. **Keep your property well-lit.** Consider installing motion-sensor lights, or bright exterior lights on a timer, to deter potential thieves from targeting your home.
- 4. **Give your home a lived-in look.** Unoccupied homes are more likely to be targeted by thieves. Try to keep at least one car in the driveway, or ask a neighbour to park their car in your driveway from time to time. Keep curtains slightly open, ensuring valuables are hidden out of sight, and use a timer to set your interior lights to go on periodically. You should also arrange to have your mail collected every 24 to 72 hours, and to have someone shovel your driveway every few days, depending on the level of snowfall. Try to avoid posting vacation photos or status updates on social media until after you have returned home.
- 5. **Install a home-security system.** Having a reliable home-security system in place will equip your home with 24/7 monitoring, so if there were an attempted break-in, your home-security provider would act quickly to deter thieves and alert emergency services even when you're not there. You may also be eligible for a home insurance discount if your home is protected by a monitored alarm system.
- 6. **Know your insurance policy.** It's important to understand your home insurance policy and any limitations you may have on certain categories of items and your deductible. Always check your policy to make sure you are covered!
